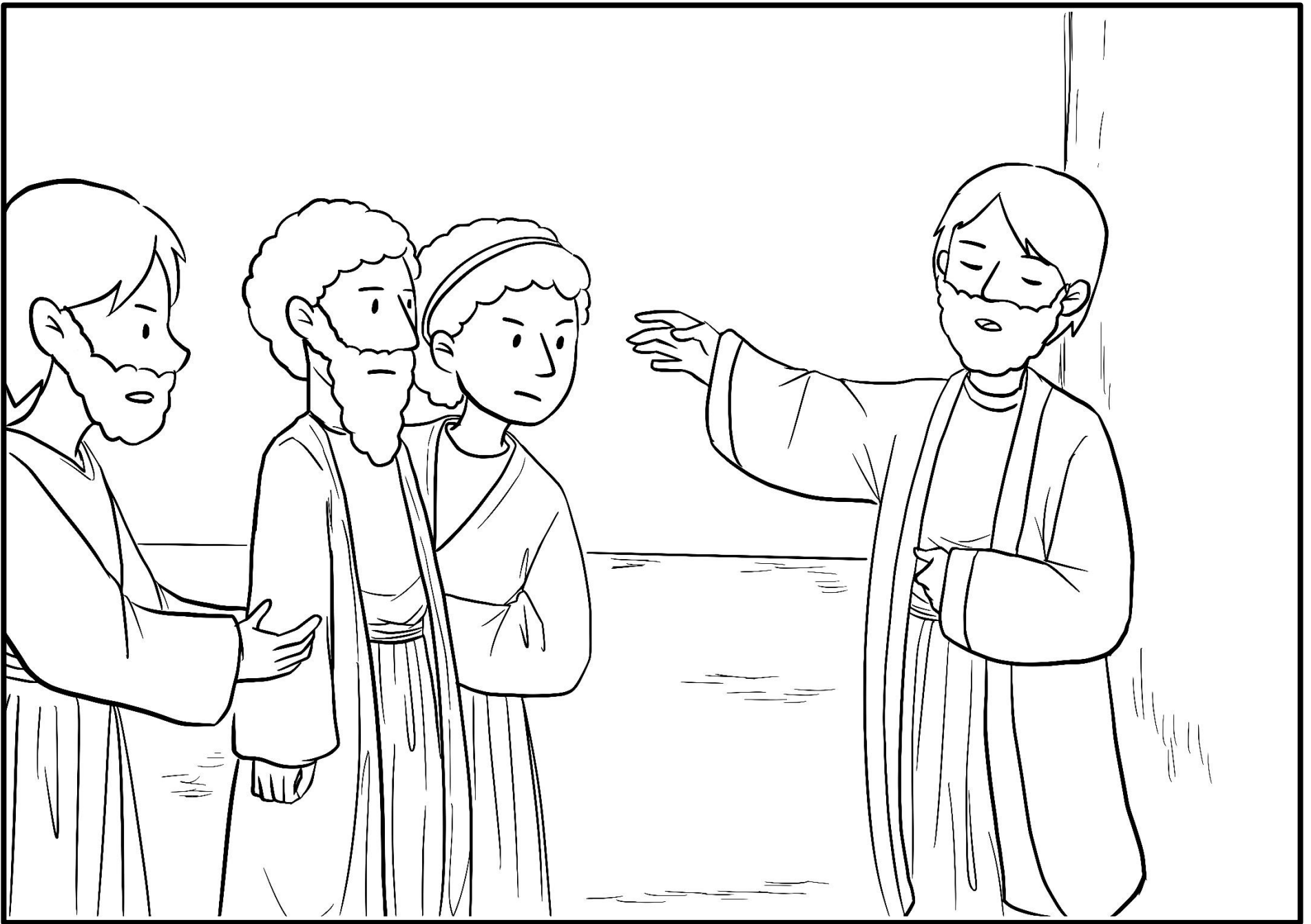




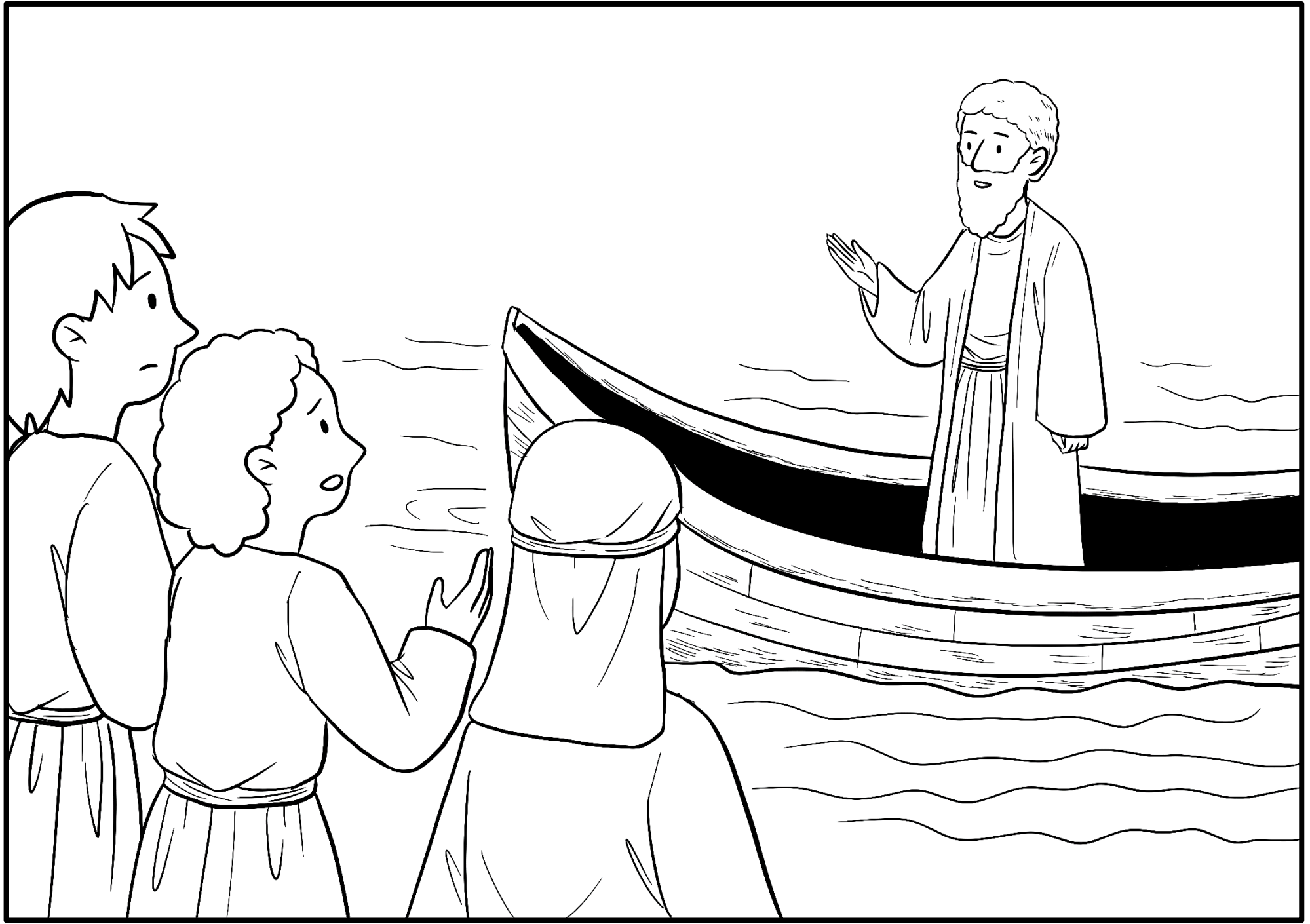
And he reasoned in the synagogue on every Sabbath persuading both Jews and the pagans – Acts 18:4
